

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
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DANCING CATS

many of them being of a rather mysterious nature.


Butterfly cat drifting aimlessly on a summer afternoon.

Cat who has forgotten how to cast off knitting a muffler.










A group of cats who have gotten up in the dark to do a garland dance in honour of the rising sun.






Angelica Transome

so disposed of her infant brother that he was not found until many years later (Nether Postlude, 1889).




Miss Elspeth Lipsleigh

tilted her employer out of a wheelchair and over a cliff at Sludgemouth in 1898.




Mrs. Fledaway

hacked to collops nineteen loggers between March 1904 and November 1907 in and around Bindweed, Oregon.




Madame Galoche

smothered her father after evening prayers, London S.W.7 (1916).




Mrs. Daisy Sallow

eviscerated her daughter-in-law with a No.7 hook, afterwards crocheting, over the course of three evenings, her shroud in a snowflake pattern (1921).




Natasha Batti-Loupstein

pulverized a paste necklace and sprinkled it over a tray of canapés, Villa Libellule, Nice, 1923.




Lady Violet Natheless
