

I say team, as it really was an amazing group of people who worked on Only Fools from the cast, to the production team right through the ranks. It really didn't feel right being paid to have so much fun and very often, we were in hysterics for a large part of the day, which didn't always go down too well with the Director and Producer.

One moment in particular was the Batman and Robin sequence. Every time I looked at Rodney (Nick Lyndhurst) dressed as Robin I just fell about laughing and of course every time he looked at me dressed as Batman with my silly little bat ears, he was as equally convulsed.

As I once acknowledged at a BAFTA evening, John gave me the ammunition and I fired the gun and I know the rest of the cast felt that too. 

Talk of the Town, Reading.



I don't believe you sometimes, Del. Here I am, trying to clinch a business deal and you've nicked my client's wig - Boycie

He wants me to stand in a market, flogging raincoats with 'dry clean only' on the label - Rodney on Del

It's amazing, innit? Everything you buy off him's got something missing - Boycie on Del





Trig, why d'you call me Dave? My name's not Dave, it's Rodney - Rodney





The doctor reckons that I've got more tadpoles than they've got in the Serpentine - Del






I don't know why they want these drug addiction centres, anyhow. I mean, ain't we got enough drug addicts without them recruiting them? - Grandad

You'd make an Albino look bronzed - Del to Rodney







My image says 'I'm going to the top, flat out.' Your image says 'I'm going back to bed 'cause I'm shagged out' - **Del to Rodney**


Running away only wears out your shoes - Del

Tonight, in front of half of Peckham, the bird I told everyone was my girlfriend, stood on the counter and took all her clothes off - Rodney




I have just found out that my wife has been lying to me. Every morning she says she's gonna leave me and when I come home, she's still there - **Denzil**

I'm gonna have to pawn all the jewellery again. Honestly, these rings know more about hock than a German wine taster - Del





Trigger: Was that the Italian boy?






