$\mathbb{S}_{\mathrm{UGGESTIONS}}$ for setting up $\mathrm{Job}\,\mathrm{W}\mathrm{ork}.$

THESE days of "Specimens of Printing," when so many printers are trying to outdo each other in producing examples of work of which for variety of design and brilliancy of color the world has never seen the like, it may appear rash to issue a specimen book of plain, everyday jobs and expect people to buy it.

But as I am thoroughly convinced that this "variety of design and brilliancy of color" style has been overdone, and that there is a great need to come back to good plain work, I now venture to put this book on the market and expect a very large and rapid sale. Not because it is better or even as good as others, from an artistic point of view, but because it will be more useful and so be better appreciated by the great mass of those who are trying to make a living in the printing business.

I do not claim that every job shown in the following pages is as nicely set up as it might be, nor do I deny that many of them are much below the quality of work which is being turned out by some good printers; neither do I claim that they are shown quite to the best advantage, owing to the fact that they had to be reproduced by photo process, and from originals that were somewhat defective in the presswork.

My object has been to present as varied an assortment of work as possible coming from different parts of the country, and thus embrace a larger variety of styles and a greater number of type faces than could have been procured had the jobs all come from one office.

These specimens are intended as suggestions to be improved upon rather than examples to be rigidly followed. Most job printers know the value of having something to look at when setting up a job from manuscript, and they know how this helps them in forming ideas as to sizes and styles of types, lengths of lines and general appearance.

In this book will be found a great variety of styles of setting up the same class of work. There are fifteen styles of note heads, nine styles of letter heads, ten styles of bill heads, and so on through the whole list of such jobs as come under the head of "everyday work." And when it is taken into account that every sample of a small job is also a sample of larger jobs set in the same style and proportions it will readily be seen how greatly the number of the samples may be multiplied.

There is no part of the printing business which is so difficult to explain, or to teach by written instructions, as that of job composition. Much depends upon personal aptitude, good taste, and the faculty of grouping the types so as to produce harmonious effect. There are, however, many points on which it will be well to touch.

SELECTION OF TYPES.

The selection of suitable faces of types is of first importance. There are some types which seem to be just made for certain classes of work, but would be entirely out of place if used on others. In selecting types the compositor must be guided by the nature of the business or profession of the customer. For lawyers, doctors, schools and institutions small plain faces are most suitable. For companies, corporations and State work larger plain faces will be more appropriate. For wholesale mercantile houses good, substantial, well formed faces, with just enough ornamentation to give them style, should be used, or some lines of script may be introduced to advantage. Retail tradesmen mostly prefer showy, ornamental faces with curves, panels and perhaps cuts which illustrate some portion of their business. Church and other religious work calls for old English texts and other ecclesiastical faces, of which there are many series.

But in every case it must be borne in mind that legibility is of more consequence than the most artistic arrangement or fanciful design. Where both can be obtained, of course, it is all right, but too often the former is sacrificed for the latter. There are plenty of good readable faces which have style and finish, and these should be chosen rather than those which have only flourishes to recommend them. An inferior workman will often try to cover up his deficiency by using the most fanciful types, but, alas, he only makes more manifest the poverty of his ideas.

ARRANGEMENT OF TYPES.

The next point to consider is the proper arrangement of the types so as to produce harmony and effectiveness.

In order to arrive at a proper result the sizes of the types and the lengths of the lines must be taken into account. In setting up a business card, bill head, circular, &c., the customer's name, business and address are the three most important points to bring out. These can be made equally prominent without using exactly the same size of types. A small line may be made just as legible as a large one by being a little heavier in face, or being placed in contrast with the still smaller types which are near it. Then the length of the line has much to do with its prominence. But where all of the types are of about the same size, and the lines of about the same length, the result is too much sameness and nothing which stands out distinctly.

SPACING OF CAPITALS.

The spacing of lines set in capitals is an important point to consider. A very simple rule, however, will easily secure good results in this respect; let the space between the words equal the thickness of the letter M of the type used, thus a wide faced letter will have a larger space between the words than a condensed face; and when a space is put between each letter the same space should be added between the words. The following examples will make this plain:

DISPLAYED ADVERTISEMENTS.

In setting advertisements the greatest care should be taken to have the main points stand out so that they will quickly attract attention. This is more necessary than in ordinary job work, as a number of advertisements often appear on the same page, and any one of them is apt to be lost sight of where all are set up in similar style with nothing to distinguish them.

It is a bad plan to space out an advertisement to make it fill the whole of the space allotted to it, bringing the first and last lines almost close to the dividing rules; it will appear much better when there is space at the top and bottom, and this helps to keep it distinct from the advertisements above or below.

RULE AND FIGURE WORK.

A few specimens of rule and figure work have been given, as they may be helpful to those who are not accustomed to such work, and the following extracts from "The Practical Printer" will be found extremely useful in the same direction:

"When commencing a piece of table work it is well to move slowly. It should be carefully cast off to find what size type it will be necessary to

use, and each column should have its proper width in ems marked; where there can be any doubt as to whether some words or figures will come into any given space it is better to set them up and make sure; guessing will not do. The man who spends a proper amount of time in making these preparations will have his work finished before the man who neglects the precaution, although at first it may appear that the latter is haif finished before the former starts.

"Where there are several columns which contain only figures it is better to set them in long lines than to set one column at a time. The number of ems of each column should be added together and the stick made up to that number of ems. For instance, suppose there are ten columns, and that their widths in brevier (or whatever type the table is being set in) are $3\frac{1}{2}$, 4, 4, 4, $2\frac{1}{2}$, 3, 5, 2, 4, 3 ems respectively, the stick should be made up to 35 ems of that sized type. A line of quadrats should then be set right across, divided according to the various widths of the columns. It will then be easy to set the figures in one line and yet keep them in proper position in their respective columns; after this the rules can easily be inserted by opening up a space between the columns with a knife or piece of brass rule.

"Space should always be allowed between the type and the rules; in the columns there should be at least an en space on either side, with an em at top and bottom. In the heads the same rule should be observed, though there may be more reason for departing from it in the case of a large number of words having to be crowded into a small space, as often happens.

"The type used for heads should be about two sizes smaller than that of the body where it can be so arranged.

"If the rules have to be cut, great care is needed in getting just the proper length, for if they are too short they will not look well, and if too long the table will not lift. The face of the rule should be dressed so as to avoid a curl on the end."
