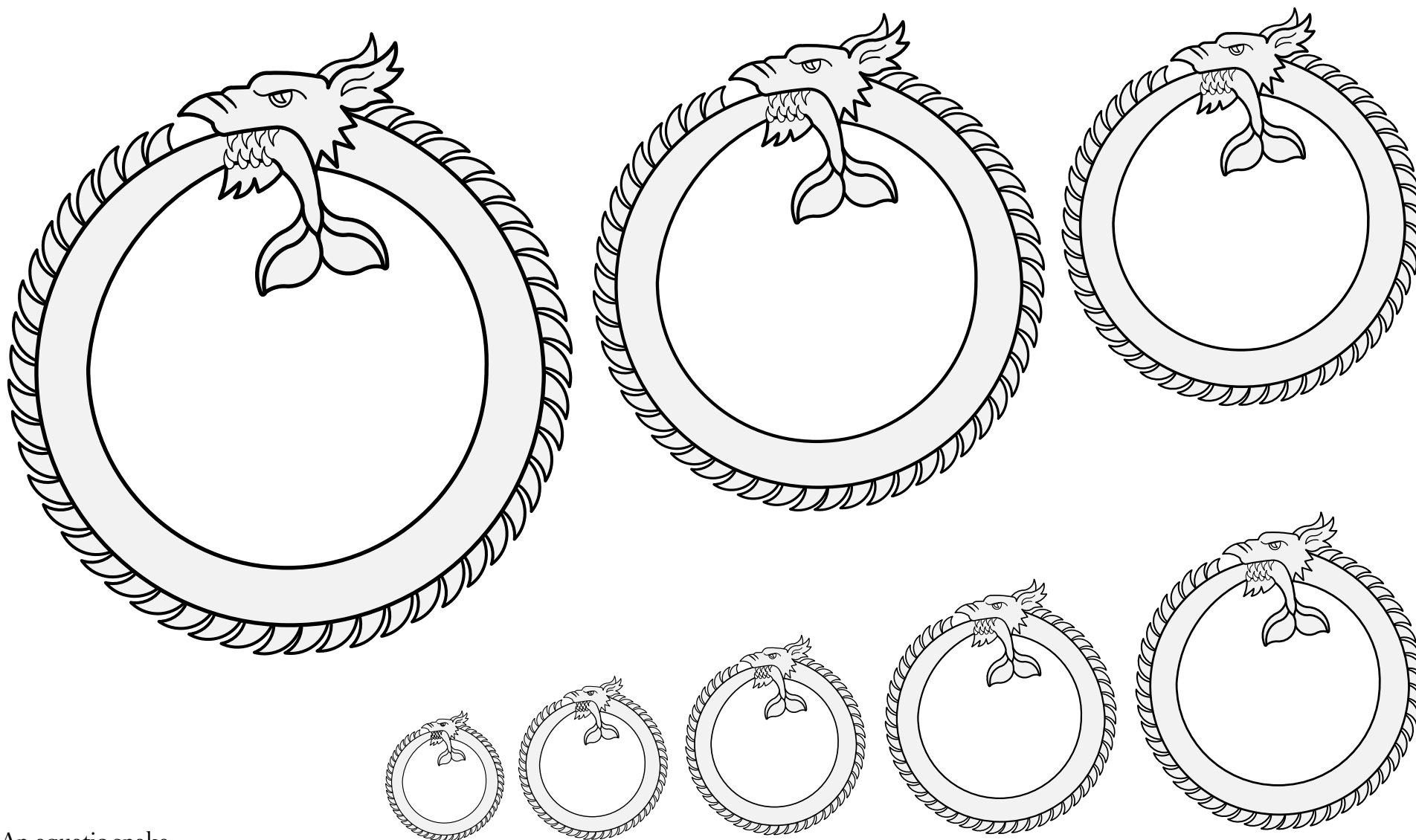


An aquatic monster with the body of an otter and the tail of a fish.
